

OCDS Visitation Program

Dear Presidents,

It has been a goal of this triennium to have friars visit OCDS communities in the various regions. For a number of reasons, this practice had been neglected. I am happy to say that the Visitations have resumed and many are completed.

That having been said, we recognize that the number of communities is significant and our OCDS membership is growing. While the friars are beginning to receive vocations again, our number remains small. For this reason, the OCDS Provincial Council has decided to inaugurate a practice already in place in the other provinces of the US. In the next triennium we are moving toward having OCDS members visit OCDS communities in their area, but not their own community.

Visitations are not inspections. They are not fault finding missions. They are a way of encouraging you in your Carmelite vocation and seeing how things are going. If there are concerns, the visitor can address them and present them to the Regional Assistant. The visitor then would be a resource to your community and a liaison with the Regional Assistant.

Before this would take place, the community to be visited would be notified and prepared. Before any Visitor would be sent out, he or she would receive instruction. In order that friars do remain in contact with you, we suggest that they conduct Days of Recollection in the various districts or areas.

Finally, if there are members of your community who you think would be good "visitors," please let the Main Office know. We are looking for dedicated Seculars who are perceptive and are good listeners.

VISITATION PROGRAM

Summary from the Provincial Council

These visits are part of the formal *VISITATION PROGRAM*. We are visiting our *Carmelite family*. We travel with love, acceptance, kindness, and fraternal charity. The goal is to assist fellow Carmelite travelers on a journey to Carmel and enable everyone to be successful.

Similar to our individual families, each community may appear differently and behave differently. Some have smooth journeys while others have arrived over difficult terrain and are tired from their journey. Independent of how they have arrived to the point of a visit, acceptance and kindness is extended to all, unconditionally, with love. A Visitator is there to serve; they travel in servitude, as a Carmelite servant.

A Visitator will be assigned to communities in a District, visiting once in a three year period. There is a 3-year commitment and a Visitator may not visit his/her own community. Ideally visitators will go to communities in pairs.

and all of our Carmelite saints


